Principal's Word of the Week: Reconciliation

Hello everyone. I hope you are enjoying our lovely sunny Autumn days, even if the nights are getting chillier!

Firstly a reminder that if your child has a positive COVID test, usually a RAT (which are still provided free upon request from the school if needed) you are still required to let the school know. It is also recommended that you fill out the online form to let ACT Health know.

We had a significant turn out to our Middle and High School Information Evening on Monday night this week. This was a chance for us to showcase to potential new students for 2024, and their families, the offerings that are available at Kingsford Smith School. I want to thank all the staff who set up the school and stayed back to supervise students who had helped out by demonstrating some of the areas, as well as explaining how our senior programs work. A big thank you to Lee Pietrukowski for supporting the planning of this process while I was away last week.

We have had our Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) approved this week through Narragunnawali the Reconciliation Australia body that supports schools and other enterprises to plan for how they will demonstrate cultural integrity in all they do for Australian first nations people. The plan has elements for use in the classroom, the school and the wider community building on relationships through respect and opportunities. More information was provided to staff and families this week and our RAP can be found on the Reconciliation Australia site.

On Wednesday I had the pleasure of adjudicating the Kingsford Smith School Rostrum Finals. The Rostrum competition involves two to three minute speeches by upper primary aged students on a predetermined topic ranging from things such as "satellites" to "trying something new". The presenters had been selected by their class as the best in their group and spoke to the primary school at an assembly for our finals. The quality of the speeches was very high and the adjudicators, including myself and both the deputies (Mr P and Karen Murray) found it hard to separate the winner given so many of the students had put significant effort into writing and practicing their speeches. In the end Year 6 student Huck will be representing our school at the regional finals and I wish him the best of luck to progress from this stage to the ACT finals.

These plants were donated by Urban Treescapes as part of a collaboration between KSS and Transport ACT. Year 2

In our science unit "Watch It Grow", Year 2 students have been looking at how living things grow and change. We welcomed our mealworms into our classrooms last week and have been monitoring their development. Students have been excited to see the mealworms change appearance over the past week.

This term, the children are learning about narrative writing and the structure which a narrative follows. Students have brainstormed descriptive ideas around character traits and settings to start a story. Our L.I.N.K. (Learning I need to know) focus this cycle is counting to 1000 and noticing patterns in number sequences and skip counting.

In the Year 2 classes we are all enjoying reading for enjoyment and finding wonderful new stories to get into! Spending five to 10 minutes each day reading with your child is a wonderful way to spend some time together discussing aspects of the story or noticing new words. Our classroom libraries are filled with lots of quality literature and home readers. We also have library borrowing opportunities each week. The Year 2 teachers encourage all students to take home books from school to enjoy at home.



Year 8 Science

Year 8 Science have started their unit of Chemistry for Term 2. They have studied density and what the difference is between chemical and physical changes.

The students are now moving on to completing their assignment which is a scientific report on how different concentrations of hydrogen peroxide react differently.

This was demonstrated with Elephant's Toothpaste.

Every year Australia celebrates Science and Technology during our annual National Science Week. Many schools, universities, organisations etc participate, with over 1000 events around Australia.

Library News


Kingsford Smith School's Information night was held this week. In the Library a lot of people visited and looked around, browsing the fabulous resources we have for the students and colourful displays.
