Busy Bees

Yet another busy Term for the Busy Bees. We partnered with Frog watch ACT and provided a 'home ' for some tadpoles, observing them on their journey to becoming frogs. We discussed their life cycle, their natural environment vs their school environment, recorded their progress and researched different types of frogs and their habitats. The children assisted in the 'care' component measuring and changing the water as well as feeding the tadpoles. The main aspect that the Busy Bees learnt was that of patience- as we only had one tadpole turn into a frog, that was in week nine- but 'oh my' the excitement generated!!! The children chose to explore outer space, including the solar system. They made mobiles, life sized rockets from boxes, as well as discussing gravity and creating a much used dramatic play area.

We welcomed our Grandfriends to Preschool. One of the activities that we did together was planting mini sunflower seeds, this planting complemented our spring discussions and discoveries.





The Puggles

Our Puggles put on the reef-themed bracelets and joined our Grasshopper friends to perform 'Taba Naba' at the assembly.

Many families joined our Grandfriends day as we planted our sunflower seeds and had our biggest morning Acknowledgement of Country. Our children followed our indigenous educator Cody and engaged with weeks-long efforts in learning about Indigenous symbols and we all created our symbol map to communicate our meanings. Many students chose to convey stories of bush tuckers, families and friends.

We enjoyed the excursion to the national museum. The Indigenous Elder Deb shared the Dreamtime story of Bogong Moth and showed us many cultural artefacts. We shared our knowledge about the symbols and the land, and together we enacted many native animals.

The Puggles learned more about native animal birds and echidnas. We learned about echidna's spines and how they use their long tongue to hunt for ants through Dreamtime stories, videos and songs.

In the rainy seasons, kids played in the muddy puddles, on sunny days, they scavenged for bugs and roamed for ant mound and ant hills.

The preschool educators shared memorable learning experiences with our puggles. For our big puggles, we wish them all the best for kindergarten next year, for our smaller puggles, we look forward to another Koori year. Rebecca, Andy, Cody and Ruby.

Stop, Drop, Cover, Roll










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Year 1

Our Year 1 students have been busy with science investigations, excursion reflections and word noticing with our reading LINK cycle of learning. We have shared ideas and knowledge about Connecting to Country with our recent National Arboretum excursion. Students had the opportunity to participate in a range of yarning and cultural experiences with the educational program onsite. We tested out our playground skills with the Pod Playground and enjoyed a picnic style break overlooking the rest of Canberra from the hills! Students refined their skills with throwing a boomerang and learning about the different ways this is done. Asking questions, sharing ideas and developing further understandings related to place through visiting a significant site was a culmination of student inquiry learning this semester. Students have explored time, money and problem solving with a range of operations in mathematics. We encourage all students to share their strategies and use hands-on materials, games and language to explore different number concepts. Students have thoroughly enjoyed their Fresh Tastes program with high school buddies. Each fortnight we shared food safety techniques, prepared a different recipe and worked in small groups as a team to focus on fresh produce with healthy eating. KSS students were able to exhibit their PBL skills to work respectfully with others in our high school Food Technology stations. This involved cleaning up and organising the learning space at the end of each session. We encourage all students to keep up their literacy skills with everyday reading and writing to record their holiday experiences with the upcoming break.

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Year 2 Aquasafe

Every morning during Week 9 Year 2 students participated in the Aquasafe program at CISAC in Belconnen. Each day the students had two lessons about water safety and awareness. Royal Life Saving instructors taught skills to get into and out of a rubber raft, take excess clothes off while in the water, float and to feel comfortable having their face in the water. For many of our children they had their first experience in the big pool. All the students had fun and improved their water skills. The instructors encourage the students to visit a pool over the holidays to continue water awareness and have fun.

The Year 2 teachers also delivered lessons in the classroom earlier in the year to support Aquasafe. The program was rescheduled on other occasions so a big thank you to Mrs Elliott for her work to make Aquasafe happen for our students.















Year 8 Small Group HaSS

Currently, in the year 8 LSP HASS we have been learning about business and economics. We have created our own business on market day which ended up in a profit. Transport Canberra has announced today that the <u>school holiday timetable</u> will be implemented from Monday 18 December 2023 to Sunday 28 January 2024 inclusive.

The school holiday bus timetable will deliver the same reliable network and frequency that is currently in place while only removing the school services and diversions over the six-week period.

Free travel will be available on Christmas Day and from 5:00 pm New Year's Eve for bus and light rail services.

Christmas Day

Other changes over this period include a special Christmas Day bus timetable. Light rail will run to a regular Sunday/public holiday frequency.

New Year's Eve

On <u>New Year's Eve</u>, a regular Sunday bus timetable will operate until 10:00 pm, followed by additional Rapid services scheduled after 10:00 pm (excluding the Rapid 8) to support the New Year's Eve celebrations.

Light rail will deliver an extended timetable and increased services on New Year's Eve. This will offer 10-minute frequency from 4:30 pm from Gungahlin Place until last service at 1:00 am, and 5:00 pm from Alinga Street until last service at 1:30 am.
